

Innovation Unhinged!

Essential Question for this learning

What strategies and mindsets need to be recast to increase innovation in schools?

Participant Outcomes/Deliverables

- Recognize the characteristics of innovative educators
- 2. Employ practical dreaming to revolutionize the learner experience
- 3. Examine ways to infuse experimentation and problem solving into the curriculum
- 4. Identify guiding principles that foster sticky teaching and learning

Key Take-Aways from this Session

- ✓ New ideas can't be added to the day without subtracting the old.
- ✓ The formula for bringing innovative practices into the classroom is not formulaic.
- ✓ Setting inhibitions aside allows us to approach our work with a level of confidence and curiosity that's infectious.



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Strengths Make the World Go Round

Essential Question for this learning

How does a strengths-based culture differ from what we may see in a typical school/district setting?

Participant Outcomes/Deliverables

- Develop shared meaning around strengths based teaching, learning, and leadership
- 2. Uncover ways to make the most of your own naturally reoccurring talents
- 3. Capitalize on the power of defining moments
- 4. Introduce activities with intrinsic value

Key Take-Aways from this Session

- ✓ Talents cannot be taught or learned to the same degree of excellence as strengths.
- ✓ Students labeled 'talented' or 'smart' begin to identify with these labels, leaving them more vulnerable in the face of adversity.
- ✓ The focus of strengths-based education is to make people's strengths stand out and their weaknesses irrelevant.



Power Up with Personalization

Essential Question for this learning

How can we let students know we're paying attention to their needs, interests, and aspirations?

Participant Outcomes/Deliverables

- 1. Reflect on the nuances of personalization
- 2. Identify core components/criteria for personalized environments to succeed
- 3. Explore customized experiences that stretch the capability of all learners
- 4. Learn to create the conditions for autonomy, agency, and choice

Key Take-Aways from this Session:

- ✓ The best approaches become less personal when teachers carry them out without student participation or consent.
- ✓ Personalized learning and differentiation aren't the same concept.
- ✓ Doing something students choose rather than what they're told to do- provides the rocket fuel for growth and achievement.



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Collaborating with the Outside

Essential Question for this learning

How can site and district leaders anchor stakeholder engagement around universal goals and action?

Participant Outcomes/Deliverables

- 1. Introduce promising practices to increase collaboration with outside organizations
- 2. Examine mission/vision statements & determine their currency within the organization
- Use generational expectations as a lever for parent engagement

Key Take-Aways from this Session

- ✓ Schools need stakeholders on their side to support future-ready learning.
- ✓ Mutually reinforcing engagement can lead to sweeping improvements for staff and students.
- ✓ Any process must start with the 'why', discuss the 'what' and end with the 'how.'



Turning Words Into a Movement

Essential Question for this learning

How do you ensure your school/ district remains relevant when things on the outside are changing so quickly?

Participant Outcomes/Deliverables

- 1. Assess your organization's identity
- 2. Learn to create messages that resonate with a broad audience
- Recognize when a moment turns into a movement

Key Take-Aways from this Session

- ✓ No one is rushing home to read your website.
- ✓ Effective branding helps people make an emotional connection to our work.
- ✓ Movements are relational.
- ✓ Excellent schools are everyone's business.
