HBCSD will build capacity in our staff to maximize student learning outcomes.

Long-Range Goals:

- **1.1** Increase middle school student access to the most rigorous and relevant curriculum to prepare students for high school content.
- **1.2** Improve student outcomes through a focus on effective instructional strategies.
- **1.3** Ensure teachers regularly access and incorporate Measure Q technology into teaching and learning practices.
- **1.4** Implement the adopted curriculum in the core subject areas (Reading/ELA, Math, Social Studies, Science).
- 1.5 Accelerate learning for identified student groups.
- 1.6 Increase student access to music, visual and performing arts, athletics, and other options to promote a well-rounded educational experience.

Priority Goals for 2022-2023

 Increase performance on ELA proficiency levels for the lowest performing student groups by 10% as measured by the District's STAR assessments.

68.5% of TK-1 students met/exceeded STAR Early Literacy. When compared to the following subgroups on STAR Early Literacy:

57% TK-1 Hispanic to 67% 38.2% TK-1 SWD to 48% 84% TK-1 African American to 94% 25% TK-1 English Learners to 35% 79% TK-1 Asian to 89% 28% TK-1 At-risk/SED to 38%

72.2% of 1st-8th grade students met/exceeded **STAR Reading**. When compared to the following subgroups on STAR Reading (1st-8th):

 62% Hispanic to 72%
 39.3% SWD to 40%

 61% African American to 71%
 28.3% English Learners to 38%

 83% Asian to 93%
 22.9% At-risk/SED to 33%

 Increase number of middle school students accessing mathematics courses that provide grade level curriculum from 82.5% (1534/1858) to 92.5%.

HBCSD will provide students with the resources and tools necessary to develop their social-emotional skills and support learning and well-being.

Long-Range Goals:

- **2.1** Develop and implement a tiered system of assessment and support.
- 2.2 Increase consistency of school-wide student behavior expectations, interventions and tracking of outcomes.
- 2.3 Fine-tune safety measures, protocols, and districtwide emergency response for all sites and work locations.
- **2.4** Develop systems and plans for the timely maintenance and/or replacement of facilities, equipment, and technology infrastructure.

- Increase teacher preparedness to implement the five social-emotional learning (SEL) core competencies (self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making) in their instructional practices from 45% feeling very or extremely prepared in self-awareness, 44% in self-management, 42% in social awareness, 41% in relationship skills, and 50% in responsible decision-making to 75%, as measured by teacher self-report (Hanover survey).
- Revise districtwide and school safety plans and identify areas for future training and implementation.


Focus Area 3: Engaged Community

- Develop framework for how each school site and work location will align priorities to the District's vision, mission, learner profile, and strategic plan.
